6. Round off to the nearest nickel.

RUSH ORDERS

3. If you want it within 4-6 days after we receive the order, add \$1.00 for extra postage; if within 7-10 days, add 50¢ for extra postage.

FOREIGN ORDERS

You'll have to pay more for postage than U.S. purchasers do, and of course it'll take longer. We cannot assure rapid delivery to Canada since Canada does not have special delivery of parcel post. The postage on all foreign orders is as follows:

(a) Add 20% for postage for orders of \$2.00 or less.

(b) Add 15% for orders over \$2.00
